More Than a Network: Iowa's Lifeline of Safety and Connection

▶ Iowa Communications Network (ICN) is more than a network; it's the critical infrastructure backbone for our State. We're proud to serve Iowans by delivering essential services that connect our communities, ensuring safety, and providing access to vital resources.



Every 911 call that's made in Iowa is transported across the Network.




Iowa's hospitals and clinics are connected together. They can share imaging, while keeping traffic inside the State.




Connections to courthouses, driver's license stations, and workforce development offices.

The Value of the ICN


Reinvests Back to the Private Sector

 ICN reinvested \$22.1 million in Fiscal Year 2025, \$8.1 million to private telecoms and the remainder to the private sector.

\$138 Millions in Savings

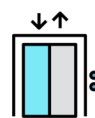
 Over the years, ICN has saved Iowa's schools, libraries, hospitals, clinics and healthcare providers in telecom services.

Emergency Support: Communications

 Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management and FEMA designated ICN as Iowa's lead agency for Emergency Support Function 2 (ESF-2), Communications.

This places the ICN in charge of all communications-related responsibilities during emergencies.

Essential Connections



Enhancing connectivity for the critical systems that protect your buildings like elevators, fire alarms, and connected security systems.



Following local disasters, the ICN provides immediate, essential support to keep E911 facilities online across the State.

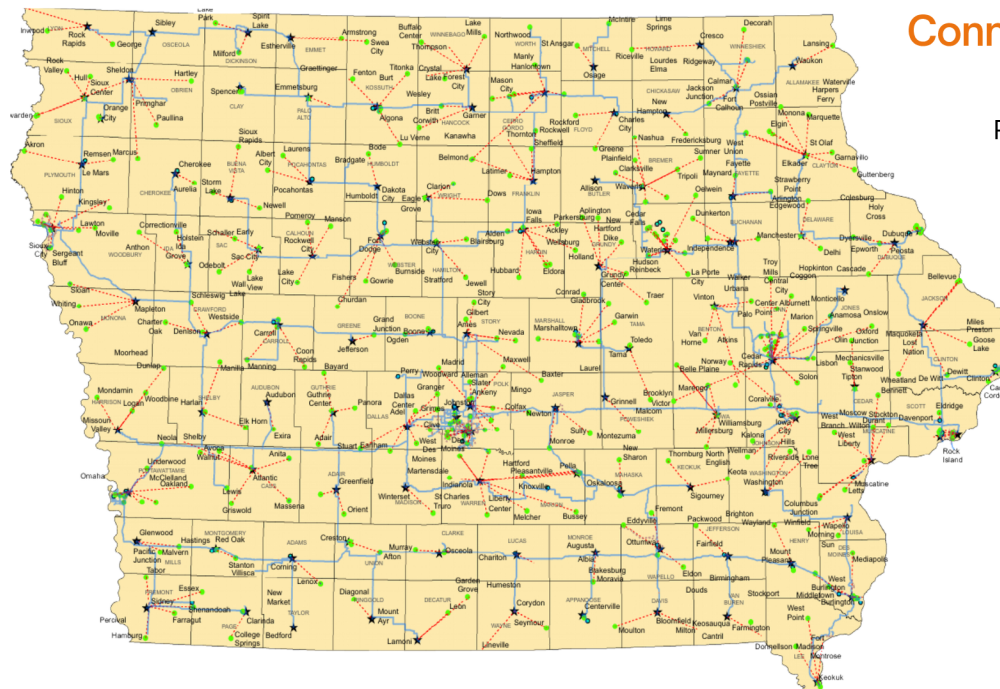


In an emergency, 911 calls are routed through the ICN.

In addition, alerts received using the Land Mobile Radio Network (LMR) and ISICS network are also transported over the ICN.

ICN connects all 99 counties with its 3,400 miles of owned fiber and leased connections.

▶ Closed Users Group

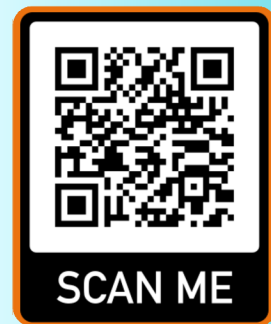
Dedicated support for public safety, healthcare, government and education sectors. All support calls are handled by local Iowan technicians.

▶ Network Core Uptime at 100%

ICN's core network has maintained 100% stable and reliable uptime since Fiscal Year 2022.

▶ Cybersecurity Protection

Over 7,400 DDoS attacks on the State network were successfully blocked in Fiscal Year 2025, thanks to ICN's cybersecurity protection.
